SYNOPSIS

Kirra the Koala is the fifth book in the 'Together We Can Change The World' series. A series of seven stories, covering seven continents, with seven important virtues; Love, Courage, Compassion, Kindness, Integrity, Respect and Gratitude. Each book highlights a fundamental core value, whilst simultaneously encouraging children's responsibility towards Planet Earth. The books' protagonists are an endangered species from each continent. The fifth book is a delightful story about a girl and a koala joey, Kirra. When a wildfire destroys the local habitat, Ling volunteers to help save and rescue the stranded koalas. A special understanding with Kirra will forever change Ling's understanding of **Integrity**.

EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

Kirra the Koala is the perfect book for promoting environmental awareness and to educate and inspire children to take care of the planet and its inhabitants. It encourages children to wisely use their emotional superpowers and shows them the power of INTEGRITY.

Included is a fact file of lots of interesting facts for children to learn about koalas and their habitat.



DISCUSSION TOPICS

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
2. *Kirra the Koala* is set in the outback in Australia. Have you been to Australia?
3. Have you ever seen a koala? Was it in its natural habitat?
4. Explain what the word 'endangered' means to the children (a species which is seriously at risk of extinction.) Extinct means that the species no longer has any living members.
5. Why do you think certain animals and birds are endangered? (The main reason species become endangered is loss of habitat, this can occur naturally but is more often caused by human interference.)
6. How does Ling show integrity?
7. Ask the children if they know what integrity means? Give lots of different examples. Do they feel that integrity can change the world? If yes, how do you show integrity?
8. Read through the koala facts together. Do you know any more facts?
9. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?

Activity: DESIGN A POSTER

In the book, Ling loves helping out at the koala sanctuary, looking after sick, injured and orphaned koalas.

On the next page, have a go at designing your own poster to raise awareness about the endangered koala bear. An endangered species is a species that is very likely to become extinct in the near future. Why not use some facts at the back of the book.

Here are some questions and things to think about when making your 'Save the koala' poster.

- Where does it live?
- What does it eat?
- Behaviours unique to it.
- Why did it become endangered?
- What is being done now to protect it?
- How can people help with the conservation effort?

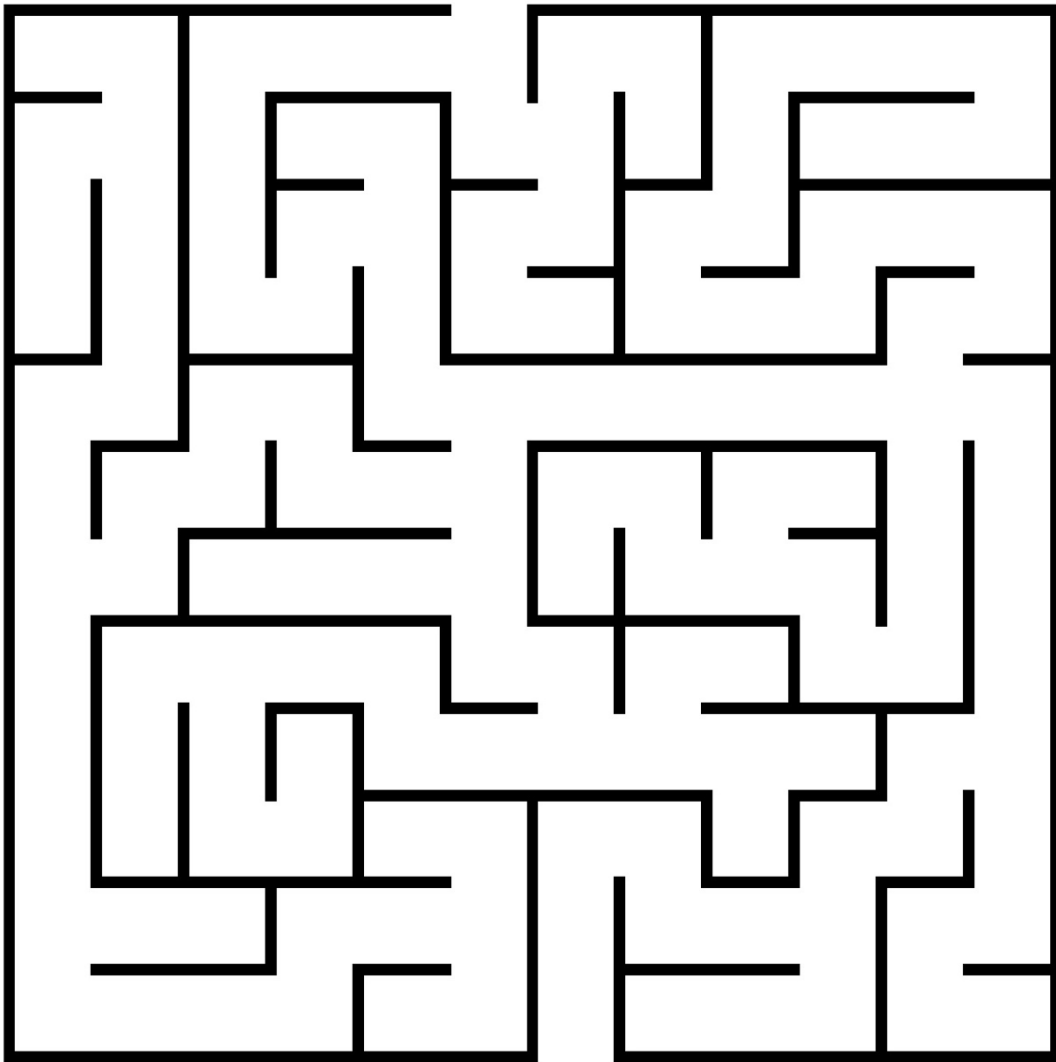

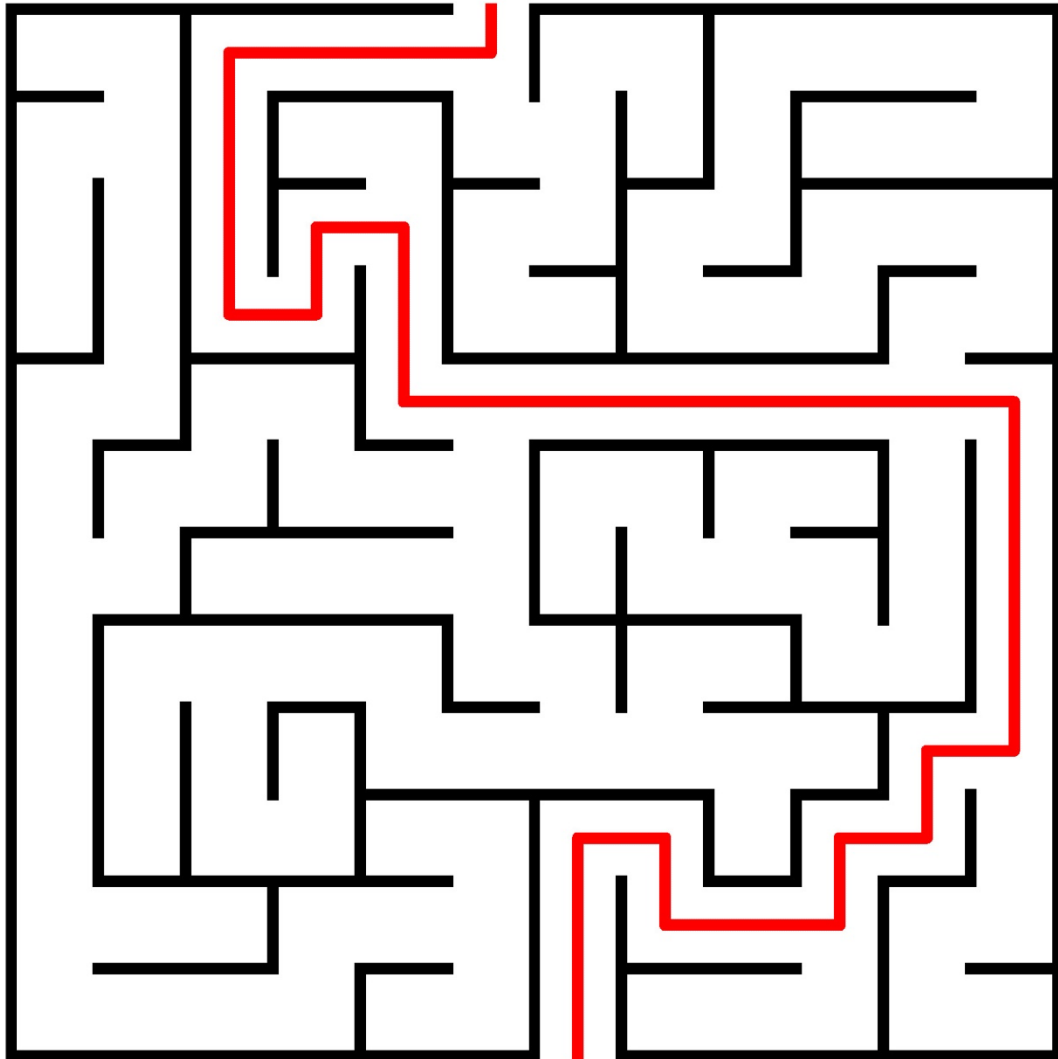
