
When a boy and a dog meet, an unbreakable and life-changing bond is created. A touching and timely story about welcoming newcomers and those in need.

EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

Finding You is a touching and heartfelt story about an unbreakable and life-changing bond between a boy and a dog. It's a timely tale that provides an excellent point for discussions about welcoming newcomers, especially people in need. Loss, kindness and hope are key themes.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

Before, during and after reading the book

- I. Introduce Finding YOU to the children and ask them what they think the story might be about.
- 2. Where do the boy and dog go on their adventures? Are other people pleased to see them or not?
- 3. What is the connection between the boy and the dog? How do they relate to each other? Ask the children to think of a name for the boy and the dog? What name would the dog call his human? And what name would the boy call the dog?
- **4.** Ask the children what 'kindness' means. This can then move on to talking about empathy and compassion. This book offers a good opportunity to talk about homelessness and those less fortunate.
- 5. What's the twist at the end of the story? Did anyone guess the twist earlier on?
- **6.** Ask the children if they have a close bond with a pet/animals? What sort of relationship is it? Playful, comforting, fun, etc.?
- 7. How do you think the boy feels at the end of the story? What do you think might happen next?
- 8. Can you think of another title for this book?
- **9.** After reading the book, ask them what they thought of the story. Which was their favourite part and why?




