
# Teaching Notes: Nature's Song

## EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

*Nature's Song* is a touching story about the relationship between a little girl and her younger brother. To make her brother feel better about his broken leg, the girl goes outside and starts to bring nature inside to cheer her brother up. This results in delight at the wonder of nature. Love, hope, resilience and the beauty of nature are key themes. This is a timely story that provides an excellent starting point for discussions about the healing properties of nature.



#### **DISCUSSION TOPICS**

#### Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- 1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. Have you had a sibling who has been unwell? Did you try and make them feel better? How did that feel?
- 3. The girl in the story goes outside. How does she engage with nature? What does she do?
- 4. Do you like going outside? What are your favourite parts of nature? The weather, the air, the animals, the plants, etc?
- 5. There is lots of personification in this story. Discuss it with the class with examples.
- 6. Also find examples of similes, collective nouns and alliteration.
- 7. What does the girl find to make her brother smile again?
- 8. Why do you think nature makes people feel better?
- 9. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?

#### ACTIVITY: MAKE A NATURE COLLAGE

In the book, the girl collects things and creates a nature collage for her brother. Can you make one too? On the next page, first cut out the rectangle and stick it onto card to make it stronger. Ask an adult to help you stick (with glue or tape) the nature treasures that you've collected on the paper.

Make up an acrostic poem about all the good things about nature using the words NATURE'S SONG.

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
