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EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

The Best Mum is a fun and thoughtful story which celebrates mums everywhere. There is a strong emphasis on teaching children to appreciate all the things their mums do for them, both big and little.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

Before, during and after reading the book:

- 1. Introduce The Best Mum to the children and ask them what they think the story might be about.
- 2. What do they think is the definition of a 'good mum'?
- 3. How does the girl in the book feel about her mum?
- 4. Ask the children what they think are the best qualities of their mums or carers?
- 5. Ask the children if they ever find their mums (or carers) embarrassing? What sort of things do they do?
- 6. Has their mum done anything like the best mum in the book?
- 7. What sort of parent do they want to be when they grow up?
- 8. After reading the book, ask them what did they think of the story? Which was their favourite part and why?






